As a club we operate and communicate as follows:

QUALITY MARK

- a) Our Executive Committee meet every 6-8 weeks to continue to develop and move the club forward. The Exec are accountable for progressing the club vision, managing each section and overall governance of the club.
- b) Representation from each team is invited and to attend 3-4 meets per year with the Exec Committee.
- c) Communication chat groups are set up & administered by Team Secretaries & the club coach co-ordinators to support discussion and supply key information on topics such as coach education courses and player development.



Whitburn FC – Community Quality Mark Award

What is Quality Mark and what does it mean to us as a club?

The Scottish FA's Quality Mark system is designed to support and recognise the work of clubs and teams who have a desire to be the very best they can be. To gain one of the awards - Entry, Standard, Development, Community or Legacy - a club must reach the requirements for each level. The criteria are aimed at improving or supporting management, development structures, administration, planning and welfare.

Whitburn FC are currently a Community (Gold) Quality Mark club with ambitions of achieving Legacy (Platinum) status.

What is expected of each new team & volunteer?

Whitburn FC aims to maintain and progress its high standards of coach education across our teams. This is an important part of our Club's evidence to meet our Community (Gold) Quality Mark criteria and supports us in aiming to offer our players a better environment to play the game.

All Whitburn FC Coaches are required to attend the following courses:

Coaching between ages 6-11yrs Level 1.1 Introduction to Coaching Level 1.2 Children's Coaching Certificate Level 1.3 Children's Coaching Award

Coaching players 13yrs+ Level 1.1 Introduction to Coaching Level 1.2 Youth/Adult Coaching Certificate Level 1.3 Youth/Adult Coaching Award

Additionally, the club also require 2 coaches within the whole club to attend courses – Level 2 Children's Award (6-12yrs) Level 2 C Licence (12yrs+) Physical Preparation (Children) Physical Preparation (Youth) Level 1 Goalkeeping course

Payment / Booking courses

All coach education courses are paid for by the Club. The Club also invests in Coaches who wish to progress up the Scottish FA Coach Education ladder and, should a Coach wish to attend a Level 2 Children's or Level 2 C Licence course, please discuss further with the Coach Coordinator.



Speak to your Team Secretary in the first instance to be added to the authorised list with the Coach Coordinator, who will then supply information on coaching pathways and advise the process for booking, and being reimbursed for, courses.

New Team Important Information

Club Secretary or an assigned Exec committee rep will register the new team. Each team must appoint a Coach, First Aider, Assistant Coach & Team Secretary.

Each Official must be full SYFA member – complete Club application supplying two references, complete two mandatory courses (Children's Wellbeing & Mental Health) and the PVG process. Given speedy responses from applicant and Referees, this can be completed in five weeks, but can take longer, particularly during new season registration periods.

Please see the role descriptions for each of these positions for an indication of the work and time involved.

Club Financial Information

Club Account

All players are members of the club and not the team. The Team is an age group of the Club and each player/parent is an individual member respectively. All monies, however raised and/or donated to the Club or an individual Team, become and remain under the control of the Team or ultimately the Club.

The Club Constitution, paragraph 12 states: In the event of Dissolution of the Club, any assets remaining after settlement of all outstanding debts and liabilities shall not be distributed amongst the members, but shall be given to Whitburn CSC or, failing which, to some other charitable body or institution having similar objectives to those of the Club.

Individual Team Account

Each new Team is required to set up their own bank account and have 2 (non-related) signatories to access the account. These accounts are to be accessible to the Exec Committee at all times, as all are governed by the Club's constitution.

The purpose of a Team account is for receiving funds from the Club for running costs (referee fees, pitch hire, registration costs etc); for its banking of fundraising for Team social events; and funds from the Team's sponsor for kit etc.

The Club Constitution, paragraph 12 states: In the event of winding up or dissolution of a member team, any assets remaining after settlement of all outstanding debts and liabilities shall not be distributed amongst its members, but shall be given to the Club, Whitburn FC.



Fundraising

All funds raised by individual teams will be placed into the team account and can be spent at any time. Teams must get permission to fundraise in order that the Club can co-ordinate this activity and ratify the purpose of the fundraising event through the Exec Committee.

All teams are expected to partake in, and support, all Club fundraising events - twice a year.
