



COACHES CODE OF CONDUCT

- It is each coach's responsibility to behave appropriately while representing Rossvale Football Club. They must conduct themselves in an ethical and professional manner at all times.
- It is the responsibility of the coach to play within the rules laid down by the League, Scottish Youth Football Association, The Scottish Football Association or Scottish Women's Football Association.
- It is the coach's responsibility to set a good example to the players.
- It is the coach's responsibility to respect the opposition players', parents, coaches and the referee.
- It is the responsibility of the coach to follow the clubs Child Protection Policy.
- It is the coach's responsibility to look after the welfare of the player.
- It is the responsibility of the coach to be first at training/games and last away to ensure that no young player is left themselves.
- It is the responsibility of the coach to ensure that the players are turned out appropriately travelling to and from games, during games and at training.
- It is the coach's responsibility to ensure that all club equipment i.e. balls, first aid kits and other accessories provided by the club are complete, kept safe and in good order. Also, to ensure availability of equipment/ accessories at all games, events and training sessions.
- It is the responsibility of the coach to report any incidents, to the Child Protection Officer at the earliest possible time.
- It is the responsibility of the coach to give the parents and/or player the opportunity to discuss any issues they have, but only if done in an appropriate manner.

This is to be run in conjunction with the Scottish FA and SWFA's Positive Coaching Scotland schemes.

Any breach of these codes will result in it being referred to the Club Committee.
